





Advanced Placement (AP)

Advanced Placement (AP) is a program of classes developed by College Board to give high school students an introduction to college-level classes and also gain college credit before even graduating high school. AP exams are given to test students on the content learned throughout their courses. Students receive college credit when they meet the threshold score.

Why Take AP Classes?

High schoolers take AP classes for several reasons. AP courses are designed as college level courses to offer students the opportunity to earn college credits before they leave high school. Most AP students enroll in college with required credit requisites completed so they can skip introductory courses (and the cost) during their first years of college. AP courses support students in their ability to open up time on their schedule or even graduate early. AP courses on a transcript demonstrate a motivation to succeed and the ability to complete college-level work. This, in turn, makes a student's college application stand out because of their proven ability to complete college-level work.

National AP stats

85% of students who enroll in AP courses enroll in college. More than 1.24 million students who graduated from American high schools in 2018 took a total of 4.22 million AP Exams. That is an increase of 65% over the number of students who took part in 2008.

The percentage of students from low-income families taking part in the AP program has doubled in the last decade, with 30.8% of participants in 2018 coming from low-income families.







AVID

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID), is an "untracking" program designed to help underachieving students with high academic potential prepare for entrance to colleges and universities. The AVID approach to untracking places previously underachieving students (who are primarily from low income and ethnic or linguistic minority backgrounds) in the same college preparation academic program as high-achieving students (who are primarily from middle or upper-middle income and "majority" backgrounds). There is an application process to be accepted into AVID.

AVID features a rigorous academic elective course with a sequential curriculum for grades 7 through 12 that focuses on writing, inquiry, and collaboration as methodologies to accelerate student progress. Students typically stay in the elective annually after their first year in AVID.

This includes how to rent an apartment/house, buy a car, and be responsible with personal finance. ACE develops and refines skills necessary to be successful in life. ACE programming also includes opportunities for students to work, with feedback on their performance, to support their professional skill growth and employability. This is facilitated through in-school jobs, school-based business enterprises, and jobs within the community. It is recommended for students to take ACE along with other CTE classes in order to learn the necessary professional skills to be successful, along with technical skill attainment within the corresponding pathway.
